

FUTURE TENSES

1) WILL FUTURE: WILL + VERB

- Forecasts & Predictions: (with NO CLEAR PRESENT EVIDENCE)
- Spontaneous Decisions or Immediate plans (made at the time of speaking, always connected with new information)
- Promises Will (usually used with "to promise" and "to swear" or any other equivalent) and Refusals (negativa o rechazo) won't
- Requests (more informal than questions with "would" or "could" but the same as the ones with "can") and Invitations (similar to "shall" and "let's")
- Commands or Orders: (a little less direct than IMPERATIVE MOOD)
- Personal Opinions or Assumptions & Expectations: Desires, Thoughts and Beliefs (used with the verbs "to think", "to believe", "to guess" or "to expect" or expressions like "of course", "maybe/perhaps/probably", "I'm sure/I'm afraid", "Don't worry!", etc.)
- Threats (amenazas) or Warnings (advertencias): eg.: I will kill you (threat) / It is freezing outside! Put on a coat or you will catch a cold! (warning)
- Willingness (voluntad/disposición) to do something (para hacer algo): eg.: I will/won't work this weekend.
- Certainty (certeza) about the future: without the speaker's intention

2) BE GOING TO FUTURE: AM/IS/ARE + GOING TO + VERB:

- Forecasts and Predictions (with CLEAR PRESENT EVIDENCE, so they are very likely to happen)
- Intentions (Decisions previously taken - before the time of speaking)
- Plans BUT NOT ARRANGED YET. (Both always connected with old information)

3) PRESENT CONTINUOUS FOR FUTURE: AM/IS/ARE + VERB -ING

- Plans ALREADY ARRANGED (YA ARREGLADOS)
- Arrangements (ARREGLOS, PREPARATIVOS) FIXED BEFOREHAND (FIJADOS O ARREGLADOS DE ANTEMANO): (usually with more people involved)

4) SIMPLE PRESENT FOR FUTURE: ONLY THE VERB

Connected with

- Timetables (train, bus, flight, movies, TV programmes, etc)
- Scheduled Events (concerts, exhibitions, etc)
- Repeated Schedules (classes, work, shops,, etc.)
- Events on the Calendar (celebrations, birthdays, public holidays, etc)

will + verb	be + going to + verb	Present Continuous am/is/are + verb -ing	Simple Present
will be have go	am is are going to be have go	am/is/are am/is/are am/is/are being having going	am/is/are have/has go/goes

infinitive: **to be** - **to have** - **to go**

It is the pure form of the verb.

It is not finite (neither used in a tense nor with a person)

will + infinitive WITHOUT "to": **Will** be/have/go

be going to + verb: **am/is/are going to** be/have/go

P. Cont. be + verb WITH **-ing**: **am/is/are being/having/going**

S. P. only the verb: **am/is/are** - **have/has** - **go/goes**

will + verb

Positive	Negative	Question

am/is/are + going to + verb

Positive	Negative	Question
I am You are He/She/It is going to be/have/go We (gonna) You are They	I am You are He/She/It is not going to be/have/go We (gonna) You are They	Am I Are you Is he/she/It going to be/have/go? we (gonna) Are you they

Present Continuous: am/is/are verb -ing

Positive	Negative	Question
I am You are He/She/It is being/having/going We You are They	I am You are He/She/It is not being/having/going We You are They	Am I Are you Is he/she/It being/having/going? we Are you they

Simple Present: to be (am/is/are)

Positive	Negative	Question
I am / 'm ... You are / 're ... He/She/It is / 's ... We You are / 're ... They	I am not / 'm not ... You are not / 're not / aren't ... He/She/It is not / 's not / isn't ... We You are not / 're not / aren't ... They	Am I ...? Are you ...? Is he/she/it ...? Are we ...? Are you ...? Are they ...?

Simple Present: to have (have/has)

Positive	Negative	Question
I / You have / 've got He/She/It has / 's got We You have / 've got They	I / You do not / don't have He/She/It does not / doesn't have We You do not / don't have They	Do I / you ...? Does he/she/it have? Do we ...? Do you ...? Do they ...?

Simple Present: to go (go/goes)

Positive	Negative	Question
I / You go He/She/It goes We You go They	I do not / don't He/She/It does not / doesn't go We You do not / don't They	Do I / you ...? Does he/she/it go? Do we ...? Do you ...? Do they ...?

FUTURE SIMPLE

AFFIRMATIVE
Kim **will be back soon.**
subject + will + verb (infinitive)

NEGATIVE
Kim **will not be back soon.**
won't

INTERROGATIVE
Will Kim be back soon?
will + subject + verb (infinitive)

PREDICTION

People **will colonize the moon** in 2030.

Used with:
tonight, next week, tomorrow, in 50 years, in the future, in 2070, by the year 3020, when I'm old, one day...

Used with: I think, I'm sure, maybe, probably, perhaps, definitely

PROMISES

I will (or: I'll) take the dog for a walk. I promise!

I will not (or: won't) be late again!

SPONTANEOUS DECISION

- What will you drink?
- I will drink a beer.

OPINION

- I think they will finish it very soon

OFFERS

I will (or: I'll) open the window for you.

REQUESTS

Will you open the door for me, please?

THREATS/WARNINGS

Be quiet or I will tell mum about your lousy test!

intention

I will do my homework later.
Now I need to rest.

REFUSAL

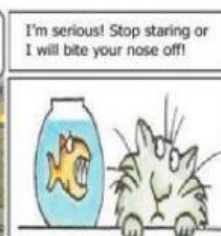
He won't listen to anyone. He is very stubborn!
