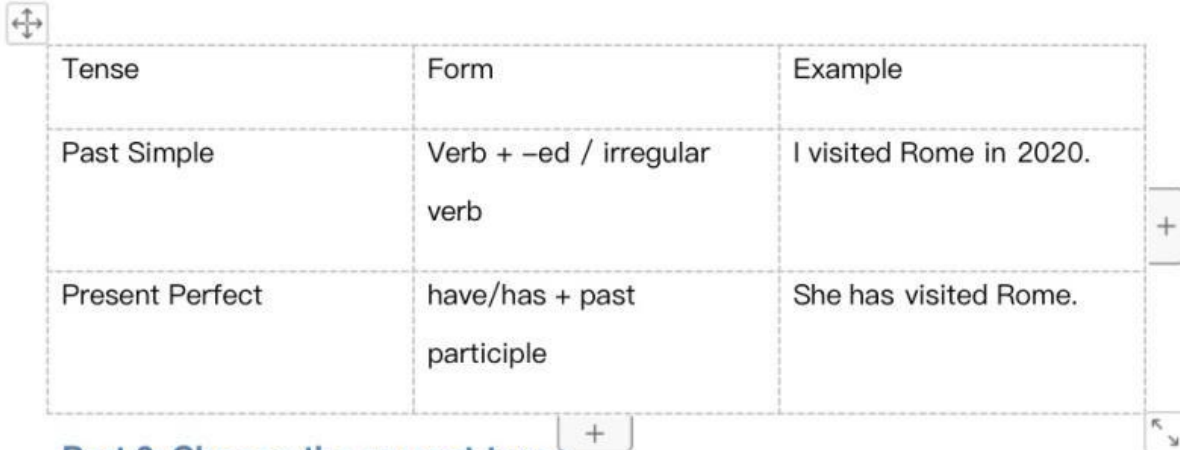


Past Simple vs Present Perfect – Interactive Worksheet

Part 1: Grammar Reminder

Past Simple — use for completed actions in the past (yesterday, last year, in 2010...)

Present Perfect — use for actions with a connection to now (ever, never, just, already, yet, since, for...)



Tense	Form	Example
Past Simple	Verb + -ed / irregular verb	I visited Rome in 2020.
Present Perfect	have/has + past participle	She has visited Rome.
