We use the Present Simple Tense when talking about things that happen regularly or facts that are always true.

POSITIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I eat.	I don't eat.	Do I eat?
You eat.	You don't eat.	Do you eat?
We eat.	We don't eat.	Do we eat?
They eat.	They don't eat.	Do they eat?
He eats.	He doesn't eat.	Does he eat?
She eats.	She doesn't eat.	Does she eat?
It eats.	It doesn't eat.	Does it eat?
