

Relative Clauses

What is a relative clause?

A relative clause is a type of dependent clause that provides additional information about a noun. It usually begins with a relative pronoun such as who, whom, whose, which, or that.

Examples:

- **Commas:**

Example: My brother, who lives in Paris, is visiting next week.

- **Parentheses:**

Example: The new restaurant (which opened last month) has excellent reviews.

- **Dashes:**

Example: The old castle - which dates back to the 14th century - attracts thousands of tourists each year.
