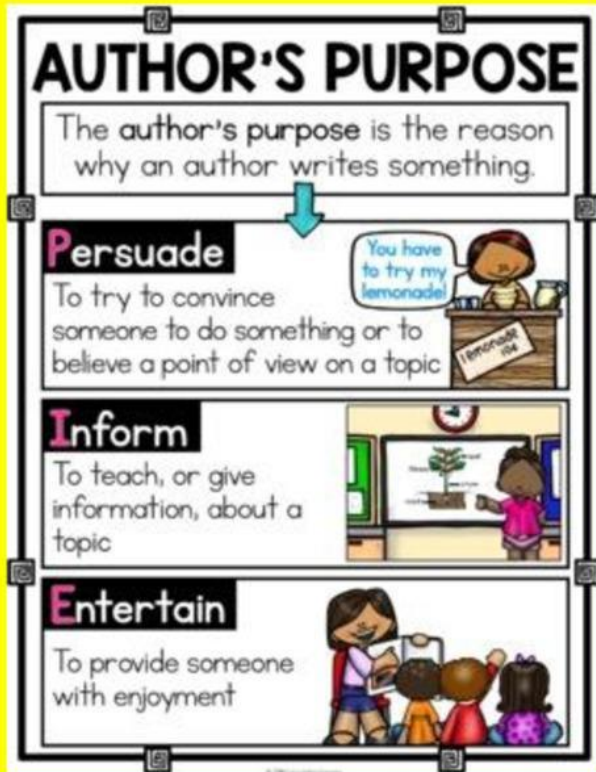


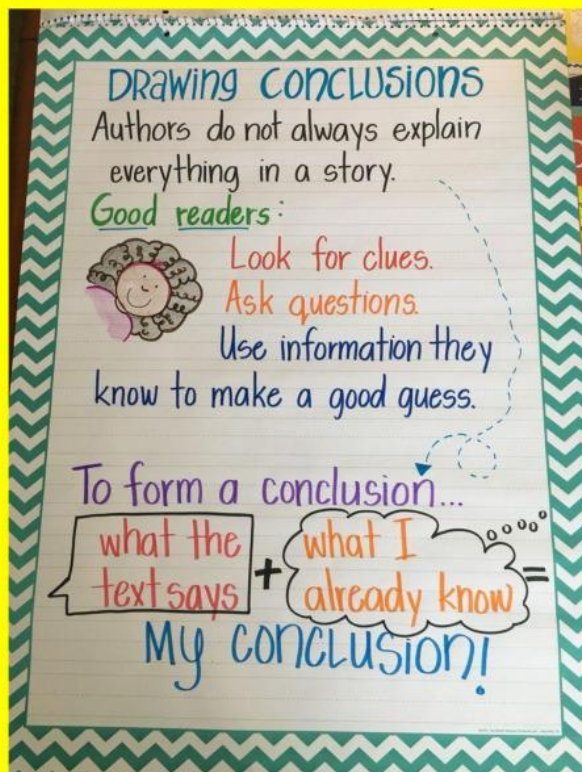

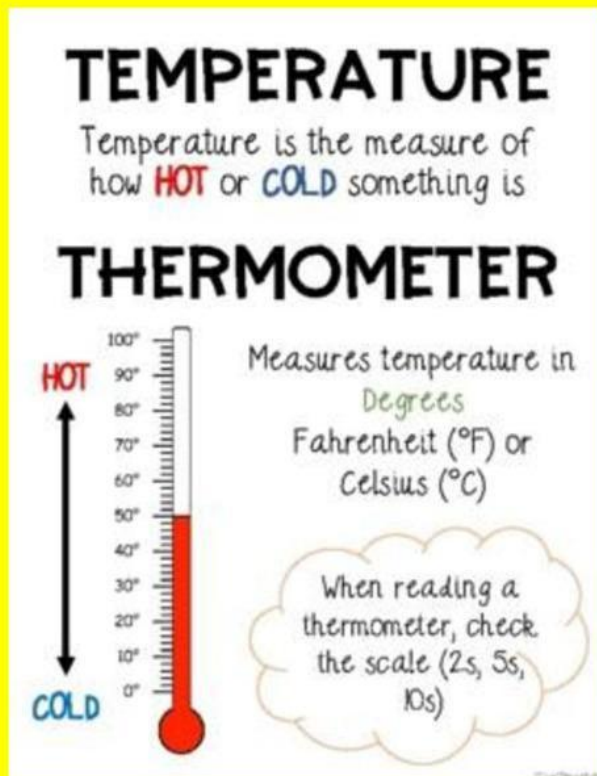
Prefix

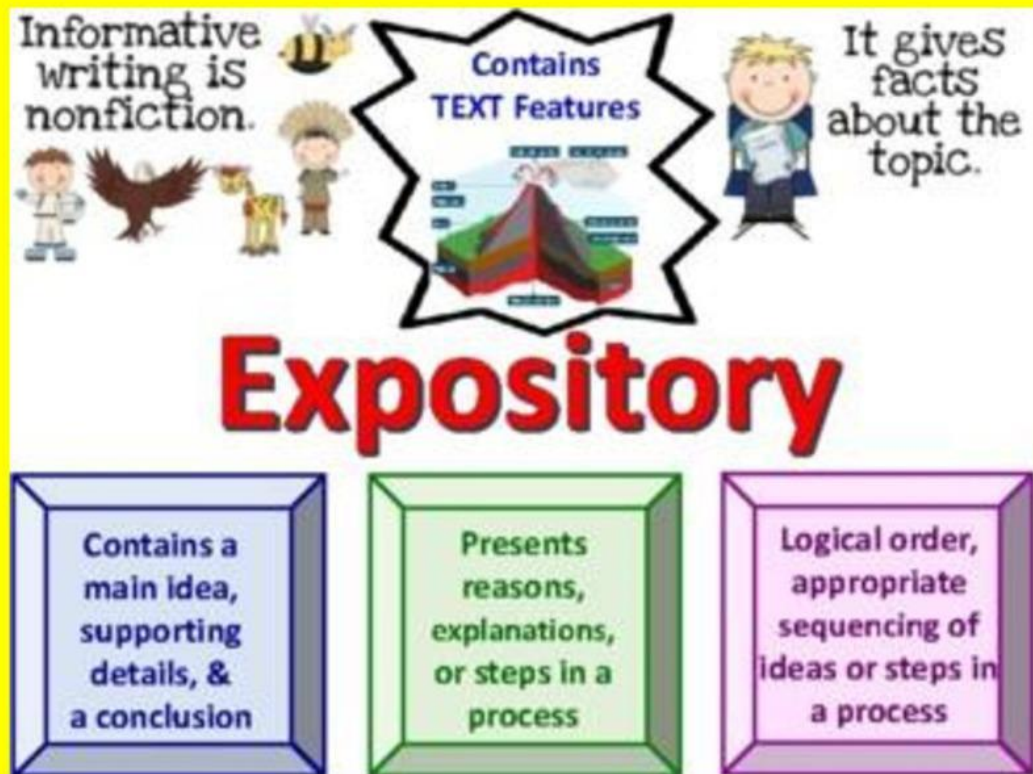

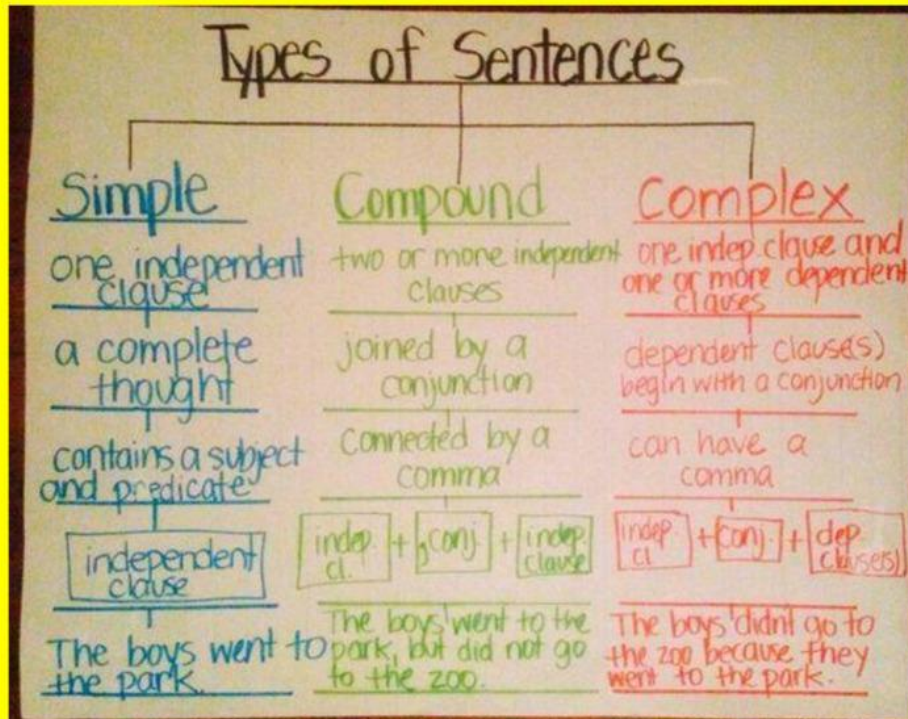

A run-on sentence is a sentence that goes on and on and on without the correct punctuation between complete sentences.

RUN-ON EXAMPLE:

Amy went to the store. Tina bought milk. Bob lost the cookies.
