Scenario	Type of Irony
1. A dentist is constantly getting cavities because they snack on candy all day.	
2. In a TV show, the audience sees a character hide a birthday gift in the freezer, but the other character thinks they left it on the porch.	
3. A teenager looks outside at the pouring rain and says, "What a beautiful day for a picnic."	
4. A professional swimmer trips and falls into a pool at their awards ceremony.	
5. In a movie, the main character tells a friend they're going to win the spelling bee—but the audience has already seen the list of finalists and knows they didn't make it.	
6. A teacher walks into a noisy classroom and says, "Wow, so quiet in here—I can barely hear myself think."	
7. A firefighter is terrified of fire but chose the job to face their fear—only to freeze up during their first emergency.	
8. A character on stage complains about how forgetful their friend is, not realizing they themselves left their keys on the table in the previous scene (which the audience saw).	
9. A nutritionist who advocates for healthy eating is frequently seen indulging in fast food.	
10. In a play, the audience knows that the protagonist's trusted advisor is plotting betrayal, but the protagonist remains unaware and shares all his plans.	
11. A student exclaims, "Oh, fantastic! Another group project," after learning about an upcoming assignment.	
12. A lifeguard, known for their swimming skills, accidentally falls into the pool during a safety demonstration.
