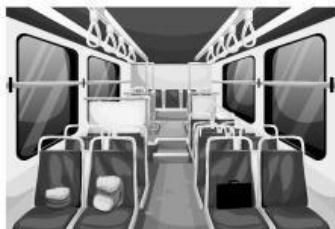

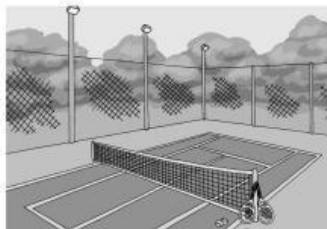

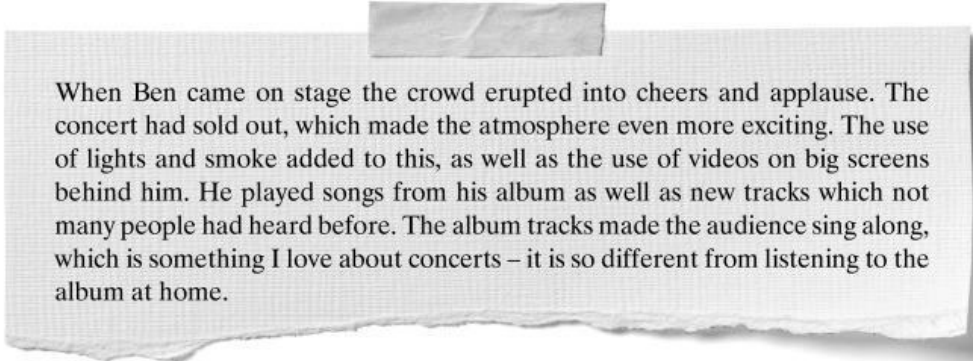

A lot of instruments, for example guitars, can be bought in different price ranges. But this doesn't change the fact that many, such as the piano, are always pretty expensive. If you can't afford your chosen instrument, will you be able to borrow someone else's or hire one?

Still not sure?
