

Unit's structure.

Meaning To be in past: Era o Estaba

+: Yo era feliz. Mi hermano estaba conmigo. Ellos estaban asustados.

-: Yo no era feliz. Mi hermano no estaba conmigo. Ellos no estaban asustados.

?: ¿Era yo feliz? ¿Estaba mi hermano conmigo? ¿Estaban ellos asustados?

Affirmative (+): Subj. + v. + c.

(I/He/She/It was; You/We/They were)

E.g.: I was happy. My brother was with me. They were scared.

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Negative (-): **Subj. + v. + not + c.**

(I/He/She/It **was not/wasn't**; You/We/They **were not/weren't**).

E.g.: I **wasn't** happy. My brother **wasn't** with me. They **weren't** scared.

Interrogative (?): **V. + subj. + c.?**

(**Was** I/he/she/it; **Were** you/we/they)

E.g.: **Was** I happy? **Was** my brother with me? **Were** they scared?

To be: ser o estar
