What was life like sixty years ago? My grandad has always fascinated me with his stories. He was my age in the 1940s. Until 1948 he had been living in a quiet village but when his dad found a job in the city, the family moved. He hadn't wanted to leave but in time he loved his new life.

He went to a bigger school and soon found friends. Some had come from other countries and could speak different languages. They didn't play computer games or watch TV like we do but went out more to the cinema and theatre. He said the worst thing was the food.
