YES/NO QUESTIONS AND HOW TO ANSWER

Are cadets going to shave their faces in the barracks tomorrow?

 Yes, they are. or No, they aren't.

Is Peter going to take a shower in his house next weekend?

 Yes, he is. or No, he isn't.

WH QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

THING/ OBJECT  What is Sgt. Wilson going to eat in the morning?
 He is going to eat a sandwich in the morning.

ACTION  What are cadets going to do next Thursday at 7 a.m.?
 They are going to start classes.

PLACE  Where are cadets going to have lunch on Thursday?
 They are going to have it in the mess hall.

PERSON  Who is going to take a shower later?
 Cadets are going to take a shower later.

TIME  When are cadets going to do homework in the classroom?
 They are going to do homework in the classroom next Friday.

We use it to talk about:

-  Planned Actions.
-  A prediction based on evidence.
-  Something that is about to happen.
