


ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

Adverbs of frequency



ALWAYS	SIEMPRE	100%
USUALLY	NORMALMENTE	75%
OFTEN	A MENUDO	50%
SOMETIMES	A VECES	25%
NEVER	NUNCA	0%

FORM :

- They go BEFORE the main verb: SUBJECT + ADVERB + MAIN VERB

AFFIRMATIVE: I always **have** a shower in the morning

NEGATIVE: I don't usually **watch** TV in the afternoon.

QUESTION: Does he usually **go** to bed at 10?

- They go AFTER the verb TO BE: SUBJECT + TO BE + ADVERB

AFFIRMATIVE: He **is** often late for work.

NEGATIVE: We **aren't** usually hungry in the morning.

QUESTION: **Are** you always happy with your friends?

USE:

We use the adverbs of frequency to say how often we do things or how often things happen.
