



Third Conditional



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If + subject + past perfect , subject + would have + past participle + complement.

If I **had studied**, I **would have passed** the test.

Meaning: *I didn't study → I failed.*

If she **hadn't been sick**, she **would have gone** to the concert.

Meaning: *She was sick → She didn't go.*
