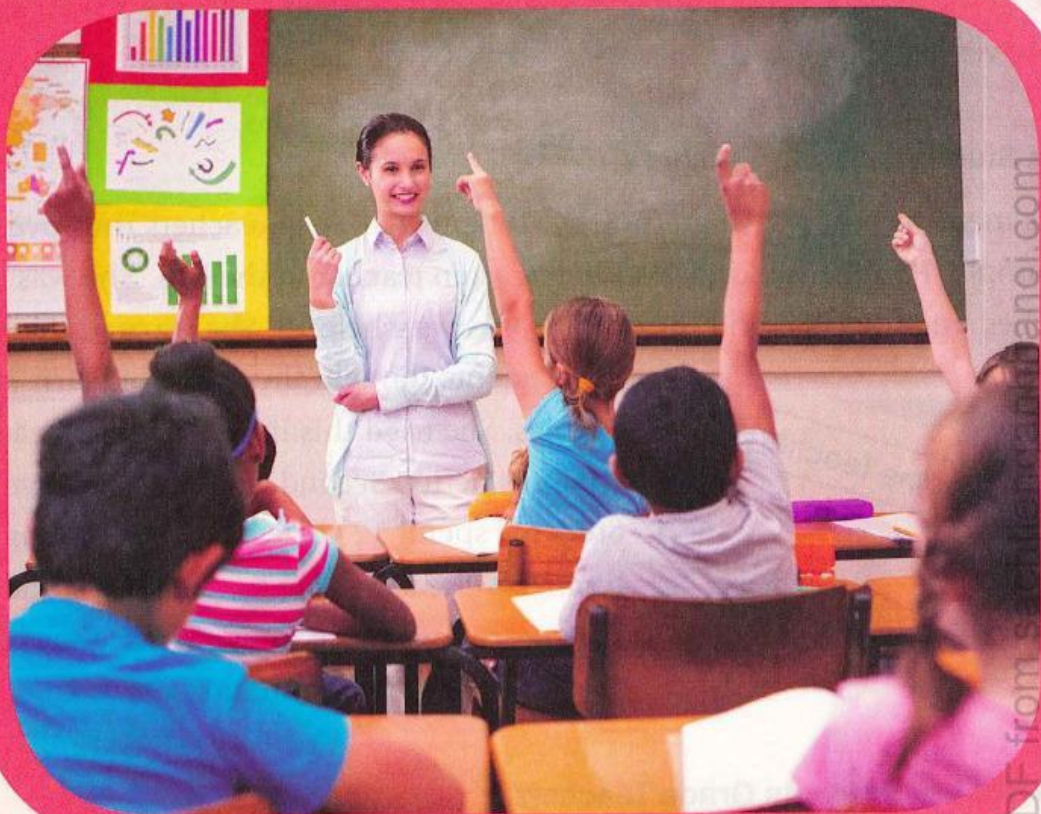


# Unit 02

### Introducing the Topic

Usually, school teachers grade their students. They give them grades on their classwork and tests. They can tell who is good and not good in the classroom. This affects the students' behavior in the classroom. But what if students graded teachers instead? Some schools are trying this new way to find out which teachers are good and which are not. Do you think it is okay for students to grade their teachers?

Should students be allowed to grade their teachers?

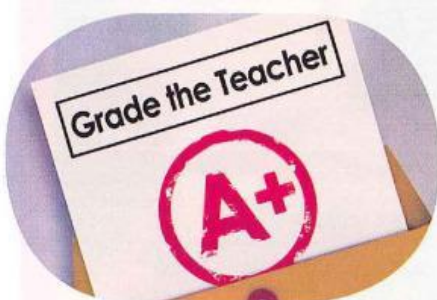

A public-school teacher's job is very important. Good teachers can help children love to learn and be successful. Unfortunately, not all teachers are good. To find the best teachers, some people think students should grade their teachers. But not everyone agrees.

### Let Students Grade Teachers

The main benefit is that grading by students will help teachers improve. For example, Patricia Wilkins is a kindergarten teacher in the U.S. She was graded by her students. She said the grading was very helpful. She learned that half her students thought they did not learn enough in class. She used this information to teach her students better. Second, students **deserve** a voice. Students spend 12 years or more learning from teachers. If teachers are not helping students, then they must have some **input**. Then, they can change their learning **environments**.



### Do Not Let Students Grade Teachers

To begin, students might not rate their teachers fairly. Students will use grading as a chance to get out their anger at a teacher. This is because students are too young to grade **rationally**. Second, grading by students usually does not show the teacher's ability. In one experiment, an actor gave a false lecture in front of a group of medical students. But the students gave him good scores because he was so **confident** with his lecture. This shows that grading by students cannot always measure a teacher's ability accurately.
