**A.** This food festival is celebrated in Germany in November.

People usually cook a lot of different food which is made of cabbage and meat. Mums and dads, sisters and brothers, grandmothers and grandfathers - all families gather together. They eat, talk and laugh.

Each family has a special cart where people put drinks and go walking with it around their town, drinking and playing different games.

**B.** This is a traditional English food festival which people celebrate in February or at the beginning of March.

Pancakes in the UK are big. People like adding different toppings: Nutella, jams, yoghurt, lemon juice and sugar.

In a pancake race, people run with a frying pan and a hot pancake in it. While running they toss the pancake in the air. The winner is the person who reaches the finish line with their pancake.

**C.** In Naples, Italy is the world's largest Pizzafest celebrated each year.

People make pizzas with different ingredients: they add fruit and vegetables, meat and a lot of cheese! The most popular type of pizza is Margherita.

Pizzaioli (cooks who make pizza professionally) have a competition for about one week. They make different pizzas outside, so people can sit and taste any pizza they want. The jury chooses the best pizzaioli at the end of Pizzafest.

**D.** It's a food festival which Spanish people celebrate every year in August.

It's not a typical food festival because people don't cook anything. All they need is to get some tomatoes. No cooking, no dinner, no races or games.

It starts at 10:00 or 11:00 in the morning. People take tomatoes and throw them at each other. When people hear the special sound, a siren, they stop throwing tomatoes. The tomato fight takes place for an hour.
