Allusion

An allusion is an indirect reference to something. When you make an allusion, you call something to mind without specifically mentioning it. The reference can be to a person, place, or thing from real life or from history, literature, or popular culture. You can also allude to a quality that thing represents. The thing being referenced is sufficiently well known that the writer or speaker can be confident that their audience will “get” the reference.
