What's the Difference?

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ENOUGH

comes after adjectives and adverbs, but before nouns. We use it when we have sufficient, and it has a positive meaning.

TOO

comes before adjectives and adverbs. We use it when we have more than sufficient, and it has a negative meaning.

Scientists have worked out that modern music is too loud.
