✓ STEP-BY-STEP:

Step 1: Understand What Each Graph Shows

- **Pie chart:** Shows nationalities as proportions of the total population.
 - Majority = Australians (73%)
 - Minority groups = Chinese, Dutch, British, NZ, and Others
- **Table:** Shows urban vs. rural living patterns (%) by nationality.

Step 2: Identify the Main Features of Each

- **Pie chart:**
 - Dominant nationality = Australian
 - Smallest groups = Dutch and Others
- **Table:**
 - Highest % living in cities = Chinese (99%)
 - Most evenly spread = Australians (80% city / 20% rural)
 - Least rural = Chinese and New Zealanders

Step 3: Look for Overall Trends and Notable Contrasts

- Urbanisation is very high among all groups.
- Chinese people are most concentrated in urban areas.
- Australians have the highest proportion living in the countryside.
- Australians form a huge majority of the population.

Step 4: Write the Overview

- No numbers or specifics in the overview.
- Focus on: majority/minority, distribution patterns, extreme values, overall trends.

☑ General Template for Mixed Charts (Pie Chart + Table)

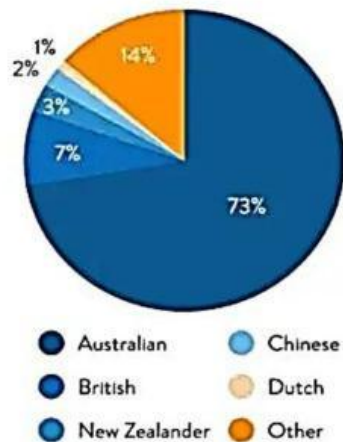
