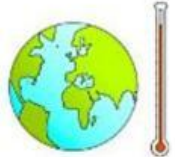

1. Contenido y coherencia (Claridad de ideas y relación con el problema global)	El estudiante presenta ideas confusas o irrelevantes, sin relación clara con una contribución social.	El estudiante expresa una idea básica, pero con poca claridad o escasa conexión con un problema global.	El estudiante expresa con claridad una contribución concreta y la relaciona adecuadamente con un problema global.
2. Vocabulario temático (Uso de palabras relacionadas con medioambiente, sociedad, acción, etc.)	El estudiante utiliza un vocabulario muy limitado o inadecuado para el tema.
