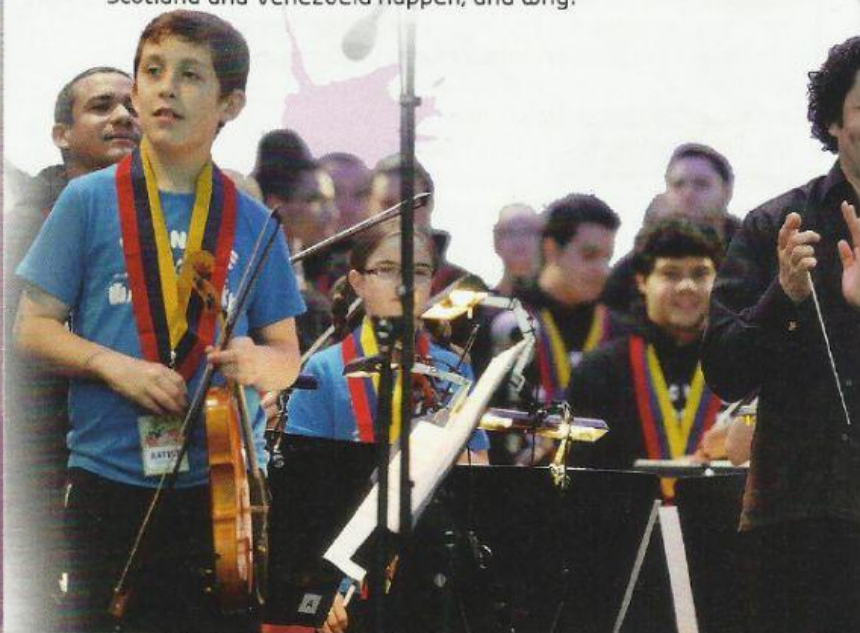

This musical adventure 4) _____ in Caracas in 1975. The musician José Antonio Abreu wanted to offer free music lessons to children who lived in places where there weren't many after-school activities. His idea was simple. Give children classical music and they learn to work as a team, and they gain confidence. He knew that it would also help the community, so he began 'El Sistema', which means 'the system'. In the beginning, there 5) _____ just eleven children. Since then, more than two million have taken part in the system.

One of those students is Genesis da Silva who dreams of being a great musician. 6) _____ day after school, she spends five hours playing the clarinet before going home and practising more. She lives with her family and they all want her to do well. She says that the 7) _____ important thing is to enjoy the music she says. Genesis is sure she can win a place in the system's Simón Bolívar Orchestra. After all her hard work, if she didn't get a place her family and friends would be very surprised.

Leswi Pantoja is a professional musician in the Simón Bolívar Orchestra and has known his musical friends 8) _____ he was eleven years old. What would his life be like if he didn't have his music? It's hard to imagine. If he didn't play in the orchestra, he wouldn't have so many friends. 'We've grown 9) _____ together as a family,' he says. Although Leswi grew up with Latin music and salsa, when he joined the system he learnt about classical music. Now he enjoys playing both.

After the success of the system in Venezuela, music teachers in Scotland were keen to see something similar, and in 2008 System Scotland began its own orchestra called The Big Noise. Schoolgirl Morgan is in the orchestra. She had learned to read music and plays many different kinds of instruments now. She loves the Big Noise and wants to keep on playing it in the future. 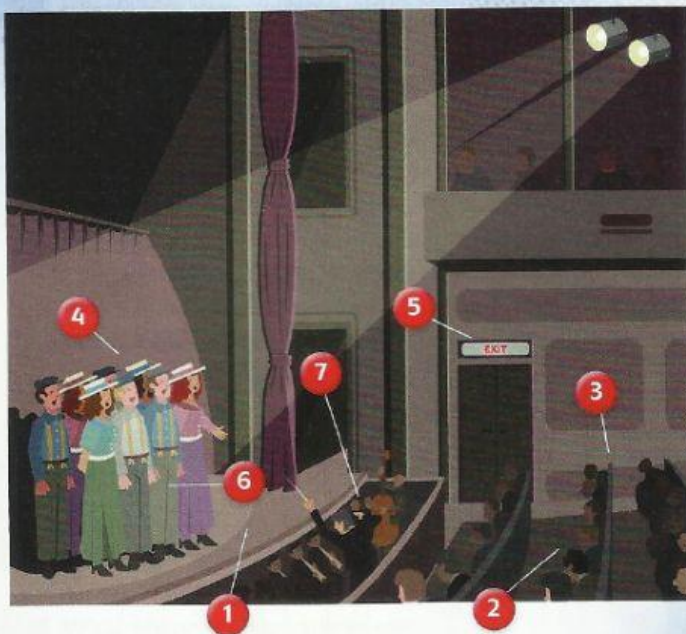
