

PRESENT SIMPLE & PRESENT CONTINUOUS

We can use	
the Present Simple to talk about things we do regularly, to talk about routines – what we do every day or every week.	the Present Continuous to talk about things we are doing right now, at the moment.
Examples	
I play tennis every Saturday. My dad makes dinner every day. He doesn't make lunch. We don't play chess after dinner.	I am playing hockey. She is running now. He isn't watching the football match now. We aren't doing sports at the moment.
