Emma Yang and Her Helpful App

- (1) Emma Yang's grandmother has Alzheimer's. This is an illness that slowly changes the brain. People with Alzheimer's may forget names, faces, or even where they are. They can feel confused or scared. Emma wanted to help her grandmother remember the people around her.
 - (2) At just 12 years old, Emma started creating a smartphone app called *Timeless*. She worked on it for two years. The app uses special technology to help people recognize others. If a person with Alzheimer's takes a photo of someone, the app helps them identify who it is. It could be a family member, a friend, or someone who takes care of them.
 - (3) *Timeless* also allows family and friends to **upload** pictures. Each photo is labelled with the person's name, so it's easier for the user to understand. The app has a calendar too. It helps people remember events like birthdays or doctor's visits, and it keeps them connected to their loved ones.
