- The meaning of *bring* and *take* is very similar when used with *along* or *with*. These phrases refer to including someone or something when you move to another place.

Mary **brought** her brother **along** to the party.

Mary **brought** her sister **with** her too.

Mary **took** some crisps **with** her to the party.

Mary **took** her favourite CDs **along** too.

- The verbs *reach* and *arrive* can both have the object *there*.

We were travelling to Paris. We **reached there** in the morning.

We were travelling to Paris. We **arrived there** just after eight o'clock.
