The Emperor Penguin

Emperor penguins are amazing creatures. Their ability to survive many tough challenges is incredible. Their first challenge is simply being born. The female penguin lays one egg each year, and she leaves it with the male emperor penguin, who then balances it on his feet and covers it with his warm body. A male emperor penguin can stand like that for as long as 68 days through icy winds and extremely cold temperatures. In addition, he eats nothing for the entire time he is alone with the egg.

While the male penguin takes care of the egg, the female penguin goes in search of food. She travels as far as 160 kilometers across the frozen ice to get to the ocean. When the mother returns with food for the baby, the father leaves on his own trip to find food. While he is gone, the mother feeds and takes care of the baby that hatched while she was away. By taking turns to hunt, the parents are able to make sure the family survives the harsh winter.

If extreme temperatures and long journeys to find food were not enough, emperor penguins also face the challenge of global warming. Global warming is the increase of the Earth's temperature in the air and water. Warmer air and water melts ice more quickly, and since emperor penguins live on the ice, this creates a big problem. If the ice cracks before baby penguins are strong enough to swim, they could fall into the water and die.

Researchers are aware of this problem and are trying to get countries to stop global warming, or at least slow it down. If countries do nothing to stop global warming, emperor penguins could decrease in number by 86% by the year 2100. But if countries do try to decrease global warming, emperor penguins have a better chance.

Baby Trees vs. Global Warming

Can a baby tree stop global warming? Some people sure hope so.

Global warming is caused by greenhouse gases that trap heat in the air, increasing the Earth's overall temperature. Because humans are releasing more and more of these gases into our atmosphere, global warming will most probably get worse in the future. This will have many terrible effects. For example, ocean temperatures will rise and polar ice caps will melt. This will cause ocean levels to rise, which will be a serious problem for people living on islands and in coastal areas.

One type of greenhouse gas is carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide is usually removed from the air by trees during a process photosynthesis. This is when green plants make food using energy from the sun. However, because of deforestation, many of the trees we rely on to reduce carbon dioxide levels are disappearing. Environmental groups have tried to stop farmers and companies from cutting down too many trees, but unfortunately, they haven't had much success.

Because of this, some environmental groups are trying a different approach: they're planting *new* trees to replace the ones that were cut down. One such group is One Tree Planted. One Tree Planted helps plant young trees all over the world at just one dollar a tree. In 2019, they planted nearly 4 million new trees. They hope that these trees will one day grow up and play an important role in helping to reduce the amount of carbon dioxide in the air.

One baby tree certainly won't make much of a difference in our fight against global warming. But if we continue to plant more and more trees, maybe someday, we'll have enough to bring down the Earth's carbon dioxide levels by a meaningful amount.
