Bringing Back The Spacesuit

In 2015, the Smithsonian, the largest museum and research group in the United States, started an important fundraising campaign. Their cause? To preserve Neil Armstrong's nearly 50-year-old spacesuit.

The astronaut's spacesuit was designed especially for walking on the moon. It allowed Armstrong to take photos from the moon's surface and collect rock samples for scientists to study back on Earth. The spacesuit did its job well, and when Armstrong returned, the suit was donated to the Smithsonian to be put on display for all to see. However, as time went by, the spacesuit's quality started to deteriorate. Museum experts knew that without proper care, the suit would soon be in danger of falling apart.

Therefore, in preparation for the moon landing's fiftieth anniversary, the Smithsonian set a goal to raise \$500,000 US dollars - the cost of building a display case that could store the spacesuit safely and preserve its quality. Thousands of people donated to the cause, and after only five days, the museum had the money it needed. The case was revealed on July 20th, 2019. It is both temperature- and moisture-controlled, to prevent the suit from getting too hot or cold, or too wet or dry. It even has a way to absorb gases the suit may give off.

Ellen Stofan, director of the National Air and Space Museum, was thankful for all the people who donated money towards preserving the spacesuit. She stated, "Just as it took thousands of men and women to accomplish this mission 50 years ago, we're so proud that thousands of people played a part in getting the spacesuit back on display for the anniversary." Thanks to the efforts of the museum and the people who donated to the cause, the public can continue to enjoy Neil Armstrong's space suit - with moon dust still on it - for many more years to come.
