The rise of the sharing economy

The sharing economy, also called collaborative consumption, is a modern system in which people share goods, services, and resources through digital platforms. Instead of owning products, individuals can access them temporarily. Well-known companies such as Uber, Airbnb, and TaskRabbit provide opportunities for people to offer services or share resources with others at affordable prices.

One of the greatest benefits of the sharing economy is flexibility. For example, a person with a car can choose to drive for a ridesharing service only on weekends or in the evenings. Similarly, someone with a spare room can rent it out when it is convenient, earning extra income without committing to a full-time business. This allows people to balance work, studies, and personal life more easily.

Another important advantage is efficiency. Many resources are underused: cars sit parked most of the day, tools stay in garages, and spare rooms remain empty.
