Harland Sanders

Colonel Harland Sanders is a name that many people may not know, but almost everyone recognizes KFC, the famous fast-food chain he started. Born in 1890 in Henryville, Indiana, Sanders faced many challenges in his life. When he was just six years old, his father passed away, leaving him to take care for his younger siblings. This early responsibility made him strong and determined.

Sanders dropped out of school in the seventh grade to work as a farmhand. At 16, he lied about his age to join the U.S. Army, but after a year, he was honorably discharged. He then found work with the railway, but trouble followed him as he was fired for fighting with a coworker. While working on the railway, Sanders studied law but ruined his legal career by getting into yet another fight. This forced him to move back in with his mother and take a job selling life insurance, which he lost due to disobedience.

Despite these setbacks, Sanders did not give up. In 1920, he started a ferry boat company, which was successful. However, when he tried to launch a lamp manufacturing business, he discovered that another company had already made a better version of his lamp. His bad luck continued, but Sanders kept pushing forward.

It wasn't until he was 40 years old that Sanders began selling chicken dishes at a service station. This venture grew, and he eventually opened a restaurant and a motel, which unfortunately burned down. World War II forced him to close his new motel as well. Despite his many failures, Sanders remained determined.

After the war, Sanders tried to franchise his chicken recipe, which had been rejected 1,009 times before anyone accepted it. Finally, his "Kentucky Fried Chicken" became a huge success. Sanders sold the company for \$2 million, and today, KFC is one of the largest fast-food chains in the world. His face remains the symbol of KFC, reminding us of his **perseverance** and determination.
