WHAT IS THE BIBLE?



- The Bible is the Word of God. It is made up of 66 books.
- The Bible has two parts called the Old Testament and the New Testament.
- Each testament has different books in it. Each book has different chapters. Each chapter is made up of verses.

WHO WROTE THE BIBLE?



- The Bible was written by many people for thousands of years.
- Some of the people who wrote the Bible were a poet, king, prophet, tentmaker, fisherman, doctor, ruler, etc.
- God had inspired these people on what to write. That is, the Holy Spirit helped the writers, who used their own words and ideas but were guided to tell God's message. That is why it is holy and is called the Word of God.

There are other books that were once in the Bible but are not in most of the Bibles today. These are the **Apocrypha Books**. The word "**Apocrypha**" means hidden or secret.

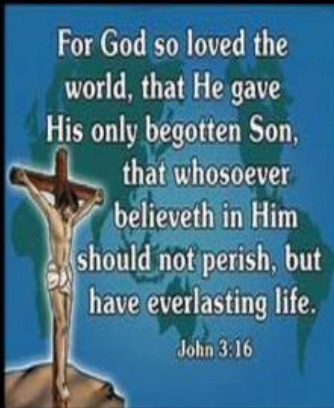
