Nikola Tesla had a fascinating life. He seemed to have come from nowhere and became famous all over the world. He said his only goal was to find things, but he enjoyed being a showman. He had many women interested in him but never got married. He came up with ideas that changed everyday life and made many people rich, but he died almost broke.

Most people considered Tesla a mad scientist. Dancers in competitive Irish dancing will execute many moves in a line of a dozen or more dancers. A judge will simultaneously see multiple dancers at once; if he finds one flaw in the dancer's look or performance, he will proceed to view a superior dancer. A dancer has little chance of earning a medal or even a place if she cannot grab and maintain the judge's attention.

The pressure this motivates can have detrimental effects on a dancer if she is, therefore, more concerned with what others think of her than only doing her best. Emphasizing clothing and look generally, competitive Irish dancing has found a place in the ruthless show business scene. "Whatever happens, don't cry; it will ruin your make-up," Irish dancing teachers sometimes counsel. Any sport has pressure to perform, and for many athletes, this is a good thing overall. But in contemporary competitive Irish dancing, a dancer's career may suffer if they feel pressured about looks.

Still, most dancers when asked what Irish dancing means to them would respond, "close friends and hard work." Though roughly half of a dancer's score is based on her beauty, the qualities of the sport that don't get points—sportsmanship, friendships, tradition, community, and artistry—still remain of the highest importance. Irish dancing reflects these fundamental beliefs at its core. Actually, these concepts inspire the motifs on a solitary dress: those Celtic designs were made to convey certain symbols, including friendliness and togetherness.

Given the extremely visual aspect of dance, exterior beauty, shape, and expression clearly play a major role in the discipline. And even if the sheer difficulty of costume preparation may be frightening, in the drama of competitive Irish dancing it is reasonable. The agility and ability of the dancers—both individually and as teams—define visually the actual appeal of dance competition. Ultimately, the focus on looks will only hurt the sport if it starts to take precedence over other facets of competitive Irish dancing.

Using social media poses a risk to teens more frequently than adults realize. Most concerns fall into three categories: peer-to-peer, a lack of understanding of internet privacy issues, and the influence of advertisers. Although the terms "online harassment" and "cyberbullying" are frequently used interchangeably, they are not identical. According to research, online harassment is less common than offline harassment, and most youngsters who use social networking sites are not at risk of being harassed online. Cyberbullying is defined as utilizing digital means to spread inaccurate, embarrassing, or unfavorable information about another person. It is the most common internet risk among all teenagers and can have serious emotional consequences.

Researchers have described a new condition known as "Facebook depression," which is defined as depression that arises when young people spend a lot of time on social networking sites and then begin to exhibit traditional symptoms of despair. Young individuals suffering from Facebook depression, like those suffering from offline depression, are at danger of social isolation and may seek "help" on harmful internet sites. When people browse websites, they can leave digital footprints. This continual record of internet activities is known as the **"digital footprint"**. How do youngsters come to know about wildlife? What kind of knowledge should they be acquiring? Children should, in my opinion, form attitudes and feelings towards animals based on their exposure to their natural environments, in addition to learning facts about them. But is this under way?

Certain studies in this field show otherwise. Many times, learning about animals in the classroom is entirely unrelated to their actual lives, leaving pupils with little or no knowledge of them going forward. While educational programs aim to assist children in identifying animals and forming various **abstract** notions about them, they only impart factual knowledge about animals. Children's storybooks often personify animals as characters rather than educate them about them.

Most children's only chance for direct contact with wild and foreign animals is visiting a zoo. While most individuals concur that the primary motivation for children to visit zoos is their educational value, research indicates that zoo visits do not significantly enhance children's understanding of animals; the animals merely function as museum exhibits, which children observe without engaging with them as living beings. Children who watch wildlife TV shows or join environmental or wildlife organizations, however, exhibit noticeably more knowledge than any other group of children investigated in studies. Children who learn about animals in their natural habitats—especially through wildlife-based activities—know more about them than those who visit zoos or learn about **them** in the classroom, according to the findings.

Researchers have also conducted studies on children's opinions about animals. Generally speaking, children develop strong ties to certain animals—usually their pets—but they do not have strong emotions for animals in general. This mindset is the standard, **independent** of the degree or type of animal knowledge students acquire at their institution. On the other hand, those kids who watch TV wildlife shows show an interest in and love for animals in their natural habitat, as well as a better respect for animals in general.
