Marathon Des Sables

Every year in March, marathon runners from many different countries travel to Morocco to take part in the famous *Marathon des Sables*. It is one of the world's most dangerous marathons because of the extremely hot temperatures, sandstorms and freezing cold nights. Runners try to complete a distance of 234 kilometres, in six or seven days. While they run, they carry all their food in a backpack. They can only stop for water at special places along the route.

In 1994 Mauro Prosperi, a 39-year old police officer from Sicily, took part in the marathon. He was a good marathon runner, so he wasn't afraid. On the fourth day, he was in seventh place!

Just after he took another bottle of water, there was a sandstorm. In a sandstorm, runners stop, and wait for the storm to finish. But Prosperi didn't stop running. He covered his head and face with a scarf and ran further. When the storm finished, six hours later, he couldn't find the other runners. He was lost in the desert with only a little bit of water in his bottle.

Helicopters looked for him but nobody could find him. Prosperi walked for nine days. It was 120° C. He didn't have any food or water. Sometimes he ate insects and drank the water from leaves in the morning. Finally some Bedouins found him. The journey to hospital took two more days. But Prosperi survived. Three years later he ran the *Marathon des Sables* again – and he still does it every year. He says, 'I love the desert. It's stronger than me.'
