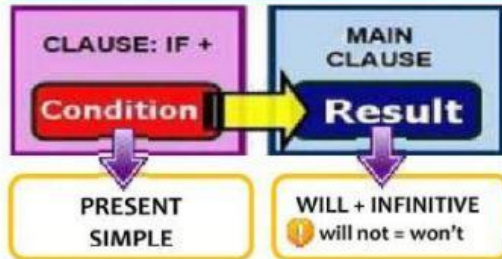


# IF-CLAUSES TYPE 1

## USE & FORM

**LIKELY CONDITIONS:** This conditional is usually used to describe what someone thinks will happen in a real situation.

Example: If I go out, I will buy some milk.

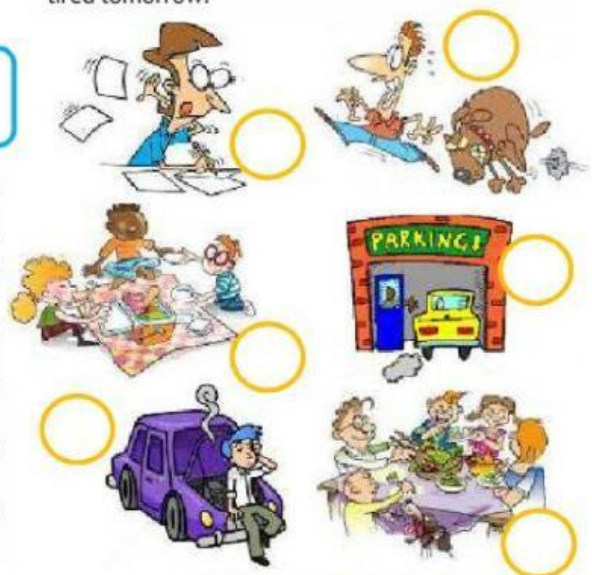
