The Rules Of La Tomatina

- Do not bring bottles or hard objects as they can cause accidents
- Squash the tomatoes before throwing them as this reduces the impact
- Ensure you keep a safe distance from the lorries
- Wear closed-toe shoes as the pavements are slippery
- Wear old clothes that you do not mind throwing away
- If you are planning to take pictures, bring a waterproof camera!
- Wear goggles or swimming glasses to protect your eyes. Tomato juice can cause irritation
- Stop throwing tomatoes as soon as you hear the second shot

La Tomatina, held annually in Buñol, Spain, is a famous tomato-throwing festival known for its wild and messy fun. Despite the chaos, there are a few important rules to ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment.
