

□ Writing Activity 1 – Email to a Friend

Exam Task Type: Short message / Email (25–35 words)

Focus: Informal writing, everyday topics

Task:

Your English friend, Emma, sent you this message:

Hi! How are you? What did you do last weekend? Did you go anywhere interesting?

Write an email to Emma and answer her questions.

Useful Phrases:

- Thanks for your message!
- Last weekend I...
- It was really fun because...
- What about you?

Example Answer:

Hi Emma,

Thanks for your message! Last weekend I went to the park with my family. We had a picnic and played football. It was sunny and really fun! What did you do?

Writing Activity 2 – Note / Message

Exam Task Type: Note (20–25 words)

Focus: Writing short messages / giving information

Task:

Your friend Sam is coming to visit you. Write a note to tell Sam:

- where to meet you
- what time to meet
- what to bring

Useful Phrases:

- Let's meet at...
- Don't forget to bring...
- See you at...

Example Answer:

Hi Sam,

Let's meet at the shopping centre at 3 o'clock. Don't forget to bring your swimming things for the pool!

Writing Activity 3 – A Story or Description

Exam Task Type: Extended Writing (Part 7 – 80 to 100 words)

Focus: Narrative tenses, description, sequencing ideas

Task:

Write about **a place you visited that you really liked.**

Say:

- where you went
- what you did there
- why you liked it

Useful Phrases:

- I went to...
- It was... / The weather was...
- I went there with...
- We saw / visited / tried...
- I liked it because...

Example Answer (around 90 words):

Last month I visited the seaside with my family. We went to a small town called Brighton. The weather was sunny and warm, and the sea looked beautiful. We walked along the beach, ate fish and chips, and took many photos. My favourite part was visiting the pier because there were games and music everywhere. In the evening, we watched the sunset before going back to the hotel. It was one of the best days of my summer!
