Queen Victoria Market, Melbourne

Anyone living in Melbourne will tell you that you should not miss a visit to Queen Victoria Market, the largest outdoor market in the southern hemisphere. In fact, this market covers several city blocks over an area of seven hectares (17 acres), which is a little less than the size of ten football fields.

This market is a historic landmark which attracts both tourists and locals. Some parts of the old Western Market still exist from when it first opened in the late 19th century. It has grown in size over the years – in fact, nowadays there are over 600 businesses.

Many people who visit agree that it's one of the best places to find Australian meat, dairy and fish products as well as treasures from Melbourne including clothing, jewellery, handmade arts and crafts. The market is open five days a week and only closed on Mondays and Wednesdays. The opening times vary so it's a good idea to check before you go. Sunday is the best day to visit if you like a carnival atmosphere while you shop. This is when street entertainers fill the market and music can be heard all over the place.

If you're anxious about the size of the market, as they'd say in Australia: "No worries mate!" Visitors can rely on the city ambassadors, whose job it is to offer help and advice on market days. These volunteer assistants are easy to spot; just look out for their red uniforms. It's truly impressive how much they know about the area and the market, and they're so helpful that no visit would be complete without talking to them.
