

PASSIVE & CAUSATIVE: same action, different story (B1)

Read the examples and compare the two structures:

PASSIVE VOICE

We use the Passive Voice when we talk about an action, not about who does it.

be + past participle (V3)

Examples:

- The classroom **is cleaned** every week.
- The film **was shown** yesterday.
- The test **will be checked** tomorrow.

Main idea:

- ✓ The action is important.
- ✗ Who does it — not important.

CAUSATIVE FORM

We use the Causative when someone does something for us.

have / get + object + past participle (V3)

Examples:

- I **have** our school photos **taken** every year.
- She **had** her room **painted** last summer.
- she **will have** her laptop **fixed** tomorrow.

Main idea:

- ✓ Someone does the job for you.
- ✗ You don't do it yourself.

CHANGE FROM THE ACTIVE INTO THE PASSIVE VOICE

Use **be + past participle (V₃)**

1. We use the new dictionary every day.

2. Mother taught him to walk.

3. We'll take the children to the cinema.

4. We met them in the garden.

5. Look! Jane is washing her dog.

CHANGE FROM THE ACTIVE INTO THE CAUSATIVE

Use **have/get + object + past participle (V₃)**

1. The teacher will check our essays tomorrow.

2. A photographer took my birthday photos.

3. The dentist cleaned my teeth last Friday.

4. The tailor is making a new suit for me.

5. The teacher asked the students to write the answers on the whiteboard.
