The prefixes **em** and **en** can mean in or into, as in endanger. They can also mean cause to be, as in embitter, or to make, as in engrave.

The prefix **fore** means front or before, as in foresight.

The prefix **post** means after, as in postwar.

The prefix **over** usually means too much or above, as in overdue.

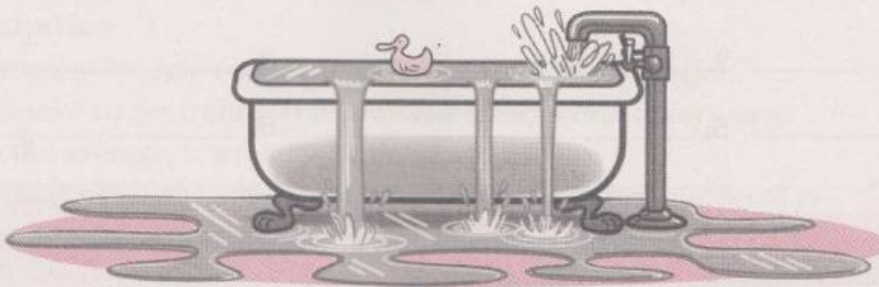


