



5. It was a Buddhist university. Established in 450 ad, it was the longest running university in Indian history. Around 10,000 students studied at the same time. However, it was destroyed by the Turkish invaders in 1193. The student and the teachers were killed and the building was destroyed. Today, all that remains are the extensive ruins that are spread over an area of 14 hectares. The ruins depict the glorious past of India.



7. It is an ancient Roman Lighthouse still in use today, located in Galicia, Spain. This structure, almost 1900-year-old and 53 m tall, is the National Monument of Spain and UNESCO World Heritage Site.



6. It is regarded as one of the most important Buddhist temple complexes in South-east Asia. It is one of the most significant heritage sites in Vietnam. The temple towers are dated back to late 4th century in the kingdom of Champa.
