Affirmative statements

My in-laws **live** in Rio.
My ex-wife **lives** in Tokyo.

Negative statements

My aunt and uncle **don't work** in an office.
My cousin **doesn't work** at home.

Contractions
don't = do not
doesn't = does not

Yes / no questions and short answers

Do they **have** any children? Yes, they do. / No, they don't.
Does she **have** any nieces or nephews? Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.

Spelling rules with he, she, and it

Add **-s** to the base form of most verbs.
works likes plays calls

Add **-es** to verbs that end in **-s, -sh, -ch, or -x**.
washes watches relaxes

Exceptions:

do → does
go → goes
have → has
study → studies
