Good Luck Around the World

People all around the world believe in different signs of good and bad luck. These beliefs are often based on old stories, culture, and religion. Some people follow them carefully, while others just find them fun and interesting.

In Malaysia, many people believe that sweeping the floor at night is unlucky because it might sweep away good fortune. On the other hand, giving oranges during Chinese New Year is believed to bring happiness and wealth. The round shape and golden colour of oranges symbolize prosperity.

In Japan, people believe in lucky charms called omamori. These small charms are bought at temples for protection and success. However, the number 4 is avoided because it sounds like the word for “death”. Even in hospitals, room numbers with four are sometimes avoided.

In India, some people believe that seeing a black cat crossing your path is unlucky. But finding a coin on the road is seen as a sign of good fortune. These beliefs may sound strange. But they show how every culture has its own way of explaining luck, whether good or bad.
