- a **vowel** and **y**, add **ed** or **s** without changing the base word, as in disobeyed.
- a **consonant** and **y**, change the **y** to **i** before adding **ed**, **es**, or **ly**, as in occupied, remedies, or sloppily.
- **y**, add **ing** without changing the base word, as in decaying.
