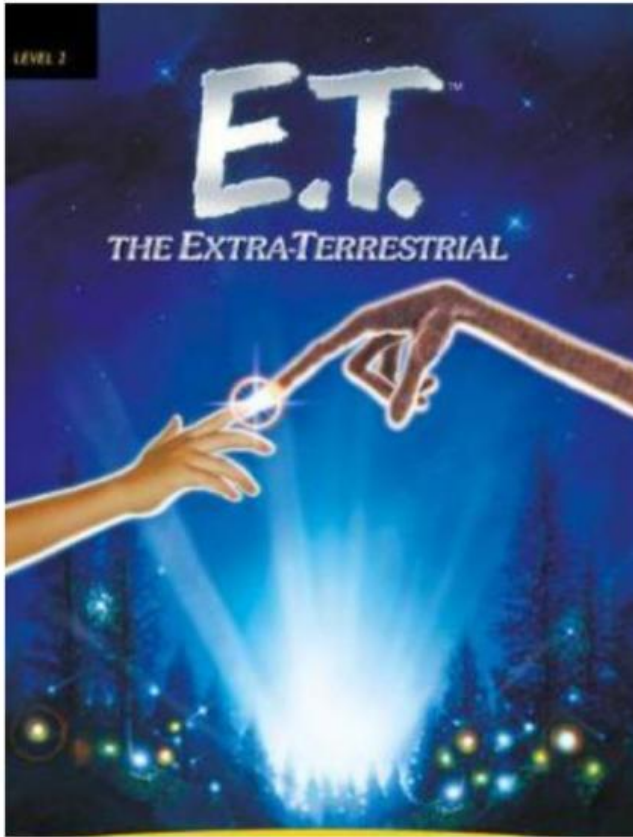


CHAPTER 1. THE EXTRA-TERRESTRIAL
