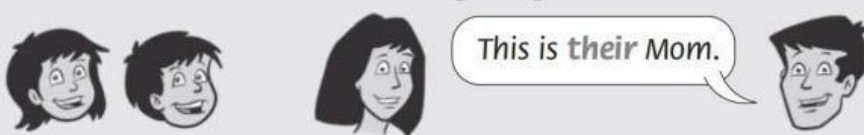


Our, their and its are possessive adjectives.

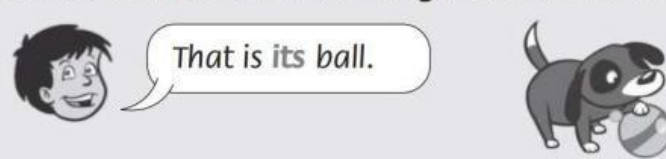
We use **our** to talk about something we have.
