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Reading - *Why Some Scenes Become Immortal*

Some movie scenes become iconic not because of their budgets or special effects, but because they capture a universal emotion. *I suppose this is why a low-budget film from Korea can become a global sensation, or why an eight-second GIF from a 90s sitcom still circulates today. You know, people don't just remember the dialogue — they remember how it made them feel.*

Take "I'll be back" or "Say hello to my little friend." Alone, they're meaningless, *I mean, they're just lines.* But placed in the right moment, with the right tension, they become cultural landmarks.

Streaming culture amplified this phenomenon. *I guess many viewers now bond through memes rather than full scenes. Some even quote lines from shows they've never fully watched — to be fair, that's the power of global pop culture today.*

But the real question is: why do certain lines attach themselves to our memory while others disappear? Some psychologists argue it's because iconic scenes act as emotional shortcuts. Others claim these scenes survive because they articulate something we didn't know how to say — until a screenwriter put it into words.

Types & Functions

- Hedging / softening:
I guess... I suppose... I'd say...
- Clarifying / reformulating:
I mean... What I'm saying is...
- Emphasising / giving an opinion:
I must say... I believe... I reckon...
- Engaging the listener:
You know... You see...
- Contrasting / adding nuance:
Mind you... To be fair...
