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Reading Text – “The Night Everything Went Wrong (But Somehow Turned Out Fine)”

Every family has its holiday traditions, but mine seems committed to creating new ones by accident. Last Christmas Eve, for example, turned into a series of events so bizarre that I'm still not convinced it wasn't some kind of social experiment.

It all started when my cousin decided it would be “fun” to deep-fry the turkey. Suppose he had checked the instructions; *what if* he had noticed the part about “completely dry the turkey first”? But he didn't. So the moment the bird touched the boiling oil, it shot out like a missile, landing in the neighbour's inflatable Santa. Santa exploded. The neighbour screamed. The turkey survived.

Then came the gift exchange. If it weren't for my aunt's obsession with scented candles, everything might have gone smoothly. But because she brings one every year, and because everyone knows it, we all panic-buy a candle at the last minute to avoid being the only one without one. *But* for my uncle's brutal honesty, we could have pretended everything was fine. Instead, he unwrapped his candle and said, “Lavender and regret. My favourite.”

And of course, the night ended with the traditional family photo. If you can call “everyone shouting at the dog to stop eating the tinsel” a tradition. The dog eventually threw up something glittery, which honestly looked more festive than our actual decorations.

Looking back, the whole evening felt chaotic, ridiculous, and slightly dangerous. But here's the strange thing: we laughed. A lot. The disasters became stories, the stories became legends, and the legends are now the reason we all show up every year. Chaos, it turns out, is just another kind of holiday magic—much louder and definitely more flammable.

4. What if...?

Meaning: Hypothetical scenario; sometimes humorous or dramatic.

- *What if the neighbour had filmed the whole disaster?*
