Many documents explain and promote green and sustainable design, emphasizing its benefits and warning about the risks of ignoring these issues. However, these resources rarely provide practical guidance for professionals, such as engineers designing mechanical and electrical systems, on how to apply this knowledge in real-life projects.

⁽²⁾ Although people often use the terms "green" and "sustainable" interchangeably, they do not mean exactly the same thing. While both are related to nature, sustainability focuses on reducing the long-term negative impact of human activities on the environment. Some aspects of green design, like lowering energy consumption and reducing pollution, also contribute to sustainability. However, other green initiatives, such as improving indoor air quality, may not directly affect the environment but are still important for human health.

⁽³⁾ **(I)** Many architects support green construction and can provide solid arguments in favor of designing buildings sustainably. **(II)** There are also numerous architectural firms experienced in green design. **(III)** The key decision-maker is the building owner, the person funding the project. **(IV)** If the owner does not prioritize sustainability, it is unlikely to be included in the design.

(4) **The commissioning process plays an essential role in making sure the owner's goals are met in terms of design, cost, and risk.** At the pre-design stage, the owner's expectations and vision are discussed and recorded. This process provides the design team with a clear foundation and serves as a reference point for evaluating different aspects of the project, such as costs, design features, and environmental impact.

(5) Owners who do not follow the commissioning process carefully or fail to consider sustainability often face problems after the building is completed. At first, everything may seem to be working as planned, but over time, issues may arise. They may discover that maintenance and operational costs are higher than expected, and that occupants are dissatisfied with the building's comfort or efficiency. These problems lead to increased ownership expenses and a greater environmental impact.

(6) In some cases, an owner may already be aware of sustainable building trends, either through personal research or early discussions with professionals. However, companies should not assume that a client has a fixed idea of how environmentally friendly the project should be. The initial meetings between the owner and the design team are a great opportunity to introduce and promote green design options. This can even turn a project that was not originally planned as sustainable into one that incorporates eco-friendly solutions.

(7) When deciding whether to adopt a green approach, owners typically ask about additional costs, return on investment, and how much sustainability should influence design choices. Green design often requires increased collaboration among stakeholders, including owners, designers, contractors, and end-users. This level of cooperation must start early, as sustainability demands input from various disciplines. Naturally, this requires extra coordination and investment, which may concern the owner. It is the project team's responsibility to assess the owner's level of commitment to green design and provide appropriate services.
