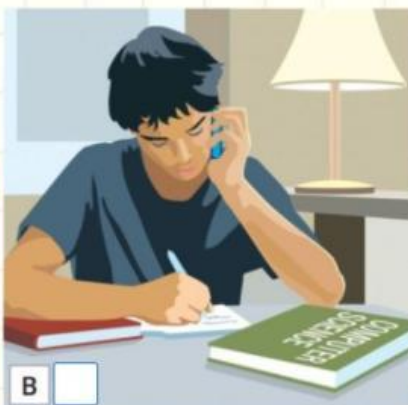
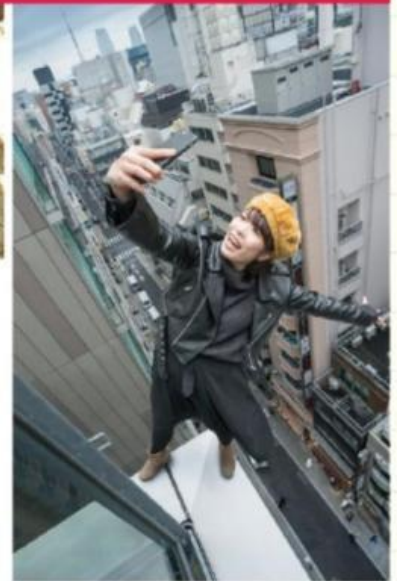
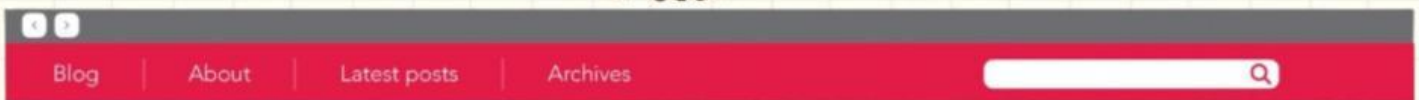

When selfies are a **BAD IDEA** ...

Think about these situations:

- you're standing in front of a world-famous tourist attraction
- you're walking around a zoo and looking at all the animals
- you're visiting one of the tallest buildings in the world
- you're looking at a famous painting in an art gallery

In every situation, you want to take a selfie. Selfies are fun, so what's the problem?

First, let's think about people. Other people are standing in front of the **tourist attraction**. Some of them are tourists, some are local people. They probably don't want to be on your social media page. Wait until they **move away**.

Think about the animals in your selfie, too. At the zoo, you want a selfie with an animal in the background but the animal is sleeping. You **wake** the animal **up** and take the selfie. You're happy but how is the animal feeling?

Are you safe? This is very important. It's dangerous to take a selfie on top of a building. Some buildings have a special place to stand outside and take photos. Make sure you get your selfie safely!

Surely there's nothing wrong with a photo in front of a famous painting? No, it isn't dangerous, but it can be **annoying** for other people in the gallery. They want to look at the painting. They don't want to look at you with your cell phone.

These four examples show us when selfies are wrong or dangerous, but do you know when they are **against the law**? Hundreds of people take selfies when they're driving a car. This often causes **accidents**. In many countries, it is now against the law to use a cell phone when you're driving. Don't do it—it's too dangerous.
