

Possessive Nouns

A person, place, or thing that shows ownership or a relationship to something, typically formed by adding an apostrophe (') + "s" (or just an apostrophe for plural nouns ending in "s")

Singular Possessive Nouns	Plural Possessive Nouns
<i>the dog's bone</i>	<i>The dogs' bones</i>
<i>the girl's backpack</i>	<i>The girls' backpacks</i>
<i>John's hat</i>	<i>The brothers' hats</i>
<i>the teacher's desk</i>	<i>The teachers' desks</i>
<i>the car's engine</i>	<i>The cars' engines</i>
