"July in Two Different Cities"

July is an important month in the United States. The weather is warmer, and people usually spend more time outdoors. Many families organize barbecues, visit national parks, or travel to other states. Students often take summer courses or look for temporary jobs.

In cities like New York City, life is fast and dynamic. People work long hours, and the streets are always busy. During the week, most residents follow their routines: they commute to work, attend meetings, and manage their responsibilities. However, on July 4th, the atmosphere changes completely.

Thousands of people gather near the river to watch fireworks. Restaurants offer special menus, musicians perform in public spaces, and families celebrate together. At this moment, many people are preparing food, decorating their houses, and taking photos.

In contrast, smaller cities such as Philadelphia feel more traditional and historic. Celebrations there are sometimes more formal, and many events include references to American history. Some people believe these celebrations are more authentic than the ones in larger cities.

For international students, this period is an opportunity to observe cultural differences. They usually compare traditions in the United States with those in their own countries. Some say American celebrations are louder and bigger, while others think celebrations at home are more meaningful.
