The three friends didn't stop, but **they coped with the weather.** On day four, it became foggy. The path was difficult to see and they got lost. Then Sven fell and broke his leg. There was no one to help them and no mobile phone signal. **Finally, on 27 October, a mountain rescue team found the friends, and they arrived home safely the next day.** Now they are planning to do the walk again in the spring.
