Up Helly Aa, Lerwick, Shetland

No matter what the weather is like, on the last Tuesday of January every year, the men of Lerwick put on what are supposed to be Viking helmets and carry fire torches through the streets of Lerwick before setting fire to a copy of a Viking ship. The boat-burning ceremony is a way of copying what we know was done by the Vikings when their chief or head man died. They used to put his body on this boat and then burn it.

However, as far as we know, the present day festival had its beginnings in the nineteenth century and therefore has very little connection to actual Vikings. In fact, the festival in its current form was probably not created until around forty or fifty years ago, but records show that the first time a boat was burned was in 1889.

Not surprisingly, this has become Europe's biggest fire festival and people come from all over the world to participate in the celebrations, which also include bonfires and street parties for a day and night. In fact, people have such a good time that the Wednesday after the event has now become a public holiday so that residents have time to recover before going back to work!

Today the torch procession consists of around one thousand people marching through the town before setting fire to a Viking boat. Each year a new boat is prepared by a group of local craftsmen and women and voluntary helpers and is kept secret until the day of the festival. Then it is left on the pier near the centre of town for most of the day so that people can admire it. Finally in the evening, the boat joins the procession through the town until it is burned in a field.

The festival, which is planned a year in advance by several thousand people and kept secret, is well worth a visit.
