Present Perfect Progressive Practice

Grammar Snapshot: Present Perfect Progressive



Formula: Subject + **have/has** + **been** + **verb-ing**

Use this tense for actions that started in the past and are **still happening** now, or just finished.

It has been raining all day.

Action in progress



Examples:

- (+) She **has been sleeping** for ten hours.
- (-) She **has not (hasn't) been sleeping** well.
- (?) **Has** she **been sleeping**?
